- 2013: 120+ reads for 3 WFPI readers
- 2014: on the rise
 - group of pediatric imaging readers expanded – data on MSF platform

Since Nov 2014, WFPI has given opinions on 24 cases, largely on plain radiographs and contrast exams with only a couple of Ultrasound studies. Opinions were returned within 24 hours (often sooner).

 - Via SUSTOL platform, 36 referrals; mostly chest CTs, a few abdominal CTs , a few head CTs; Via CT platform, 8 referrals; mostly CT chest (infection, congenital), a few CT head (mostly perinatal hypoxia)
- **Maputo Central Hospital, Mozambique:**
 - 9 referrals; mostly CT chest: infection, congenital
- **Stanford-Khayelitsha:**
 - Previously by mail. Via CT platform, 2 referrals; XR chest: infection
- **Nasser Hospital for Children, Palestine**
 - 1 case; XR chest: surfactant deficiency



- **Bustamante Children's Hospital**
 - 2 referrals; MR brain and spine: tumor, multiple sclerosis. MRI machine broken down for weeks.
- **Hospital de Cobán, Alta Varapaz, Guatemala**
 - Average of 1 referral/month via WHATSAPP, combination of plain film cases, CT and MRI. More X Ray than anything else.
- **Wendy Fitzwilliam Paediatric Hospital (Trinidad and Tobago):**
 - 1 case; XR pelvis: femoroacetabular impingement
- **Centro de Salud Santa Clotilde (Peru):**
 - 4 cases; CT head, CT chest, XR chest, US fetus: varied pathology

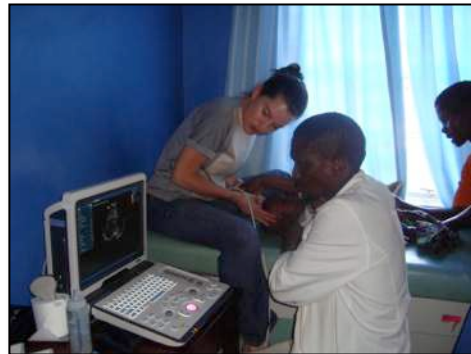

MSF/DWB US Manual - draft: “... we are looking for a practical guide to help clinicians who often have limited access to other diagnostic means in decision making. It will mostly be to help solve / prove specific clinical questions and usually for gross pathology i.e. the target audience won't be native English speaking radiologists”.



Hips

Hips: Hip is located in the pelvis, between the femur and the acetabulum. It is a ball-and-socket joint. The femur is the long bone of the thigh, and the acetabulum is the socket of the hip. The hip joint is the largest and most powerful of the body's joints. It is responsible for supporting the weight of the body and for allowing the leg to move in a wide range of motion.

Indications: Pain in the hip, swelling, redness, warmth, and tenderness. Trauma, infection, tumor, and congenital anomalies.

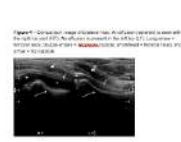
Technique: Patient in supine with the hip in neutral position. Transverse and longitudinal views.

Findings: Normal hip joint is an anechoic space between the femoral head and the acetabulum. The femoral head is covered by a thin layer of articular cartilage. The acetabulum is covered by a thin layer of articular cartilage. The joint space is normally 4-6 mm wide.
