The WFPI has secured its first grant! The Society for Pediatric Radiology's Research & Education Foundation has selected the WFPI as the recipient of its pilot award. The decision was reached on the basis of an outstanding concept and a substantive outline of our organization's future plans. With a first injection of funds assured, we're off the starting blocks!



<u>First WFPI Outreach – Tele-radiology</u>





Our first project: telereading for Médecins sans Frontières/Doctors Without Borders, led by the WFPI's Outreach Committee and a team headed by Savvas Andronikou in South Africa. The WFPI's 'on call' volunteers will be referred to the Swinfen/MSF telemedicine consultation site, open to telemedicine and teleradiology consultation. Reports on its functionality have been positive to date. The Internet site is open to health care providers from any MSF location. Some 10% of the cases telereported are pediatric. The images, of marginal quality, are taken on film then photographed using a standard digital camera and loaded onto the Swinfen/MSF tele-medicine site as jpeg images. While approximately 70% are diagnostic, the remainder are poor but show some useful information, especially in correlation with the usually quite detailed clinical precisions. There are increasing calls for tele-imaging throughout the MSF movement, and the WFPI aims to keep in step with the demand.

Future WFPI outreach projects are in the pipeline, all based on the same ethos – 'bolt on' imaging support offered to existing, robust projects run in low resource settings.

WFPI on the World Wide Web

The WFPI Education Committee' is primarily focused on content for the WFPI website. We hope to be online soon - watch for updates. Africa's on the move



Inspired by the WFPI's call, the recent meeting of the African Radiology Society in Alexandria, Egypt, presided by Dr. Hassen Gharbi, welcomed the creation of a pediatric imaging sub-society, with some 60 radiologists looking to join. The group hopes to take a place on the WFPI Council.

Global representation

Outreach Committee member Doctor Omololo Mojisola Atalabi gave an inspiring presentation during the recent SPR meeting in San Francisco, outlining the daily challenges confronted by pediatric imagers in Nigeria. Dr Ines Boechat, the WFPI's Founding President, represented the WFPI and Image Gently at the International Society of Radiology's meeting in São Paulo in early May. There are plans to host a pediatric imaging sub-meeting during future ISR meetings, with simultaneous web streaming further extending opportunities to participate. The ISR also offers website educational content and visiting professor programs, as do many other large societies such as the RSNA, the ACR and WFUMB. The WFPI is taking advantage of every opening to pool resources and create synergies.
